△ **CRITICAL WARNING:** LPG is heavier than air and will accumulate in low areas. Even a small leak can create an explosive atmosphere. Act immediately if you suspect a gas leak.

HOW TO DETECT A GAS LEAK

Three Ways to Identify a Leak:



SMELL

LPG has a distinctive odor (like rotten eggs or sulfur) added for safety. If you smell this odor, there may be a leak.

2 SOUND

Listen for hissing or whistling sounds near the cylinder, regulator, or connections.

3 SIGHT

Look for bubbles in soapy water applied to connections, frost formation on the cylinder, or dead vegetation near outdoor cylinders.

IMMEDIATE ACTIONS - IF YOU SMELL GAS

1

TURN OFF THE GAS

Immediately turn the cylinder valve clockwise to close it. Do this even if you're not sure where the leak is coming from.

2

VENTILATE THE AREA

Open all windows and doors to allow gas to disperse. Do NOT use fans or create any sparks.

3

EVACUATE

Get everyone out of the building immediately. Do not stop to gather belongings.

4

CALL FOR HELP

DO'S AND DON'TS

√ DO

- Turn off the gas supply immediately
- Open windows and doors
- Evacuate the premises
- Call emergency services from outside
- Keep people away from the area
- Wait for professionals to arrive

X DON'T

- Use electrical switches or appliances
- Light matches or lighters
- Use your phone inside the building
- Try to locate the leak yourself
- Re-enter the building
- Attempt repairs yourself

FIRE EMERGENCY PROCEDURES

If LPG catches fire: Do NOT attempt to extinguish the fire unless you can safely shut off the gas supply first.

1 EVACUATE IMMEDIATELY

Get everyone out of the building and move to a safe distance (at least 100 meters).

2 CALL FIRE DEPARTMENT
Dial 999 or 112 for emergency services.

4 COOL SURROUNDING CYLINDERS

If safe to do so, use water to cool nearby cylinders to prevent explosion. Do this from a safe distance.

FIRST AID FOR GAS EXPOSURE

Symptoms of Gas Inhalation:

- Dizziness or lightheadedness
- Headache
- Nausea
- Difficulty breathing
- Loss of consciousness

First Aid Steps:

1

MOVE TO FRESH AIR

Immediately move the person to fresh air. Do not re-enter the contaminated area.

2 CHECK BREATHING

If the person is not breathing, begin CPR if you are trained to do so.

3 SEEK MEDICAL ATTENTION

Call an ambulance immediately. Even if symptoms seem mild, medical evaluation is necessary.

4

KEEP WARM

Keep the person warm and calm while waiting for medical help.

PREVENTION TIPS

- Regular Inspections: Check your cylinder, regulator, and hose monthly for damage
- **Proper Installation:** Always use certified technicians for installation
- Ventilation: Ensure adequate ventilation in areas where LPG is used
- **Storage:** Store cylinders upright in well-ventilated areas away from heat sources
- **Replacement:** Replace hoses every 2 years and regulators every 5 years
- **Education:** Ensure all family members know how to turn off the gas supply
